WISE University, or WISE U, offers a full-service peer support training and placement academy to assist peer professionals through each step in the process.

WISE U is a program of NorCal MHA, the oldest peer-run consumer advocacy agency in Northern California, For decades NorCal MHA has successfully hired, trained, supported, and advanced the careers of consumers, family members, parents/caregivers, and transition age youth working and volunteering in peer support roles in California's Public Mental Heath System.

NorCal Mental Health America believes that peer support is a unique and essential element of recovery-oriented mental health and substance abuse systems.

What is a Peer?

A peer has personal lived experience as a consumer and/or family member whose duties include a peer support role and contributing to the recovery culture of a team.

Peer Support: Roles and the Research

Peer supporters are people who use their experience of recovery from mental health disorders to support others in recovery. Combined with skills learned in formal training, like WISE University (WISE U), their experience and institutional knowledge put them in a unique position to offer support.

Functions of a peer:

- Model recovery
- Offer support to help people experiencing mental health challenges lead meaningful lives in the community
- Promote recovery
- Teach skills
- Enhance hope and social networking
- Supplement existing treatment with education, empowerment, and aid in system navigation

Peers work in a variety of roles:

- Facilitating support groups
- Peer counseling
- Advocacy
- Personal plan creation
- WRAP® Workshops and Support
- Health education/navigation
- Cultural brokerage
- Service referrals
- Systems navigation
- Benefits/healthcare acquisition
- · Crisis intervention

Benefits of Peer Support

Peer support is considered a best practice by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA).

Research shows peer support services can have a big impact on the consumers they support by:

- Reducing symptoms and hospitalizations
- Increasing social support and community participation
- Decreasing lengths of hospital stays and costs of services
- Improving well-being, self-esteem, and social functioning
- Encouraging more thorough and longerlasting recoveries

WISE U hosts four Peer Training Academies during the year. Designed for those new to the field or looking to start a career as a peer in the public Mental Health Field. There is no cost to attend, but registration is limited.
